

# "Gender Identity and Mercy Love" Process and Videos

We welcome you into the Mercy conversation on gender identity. By engaging the videos linked below, you will connect with 150 Mercy sisters, associates and partners in ministry who gathered on Zoom October 3–4, 2020, to kick off the learning and conversation. Now it's your turn to join in and widen the circle by one more.

Each of the three videos is between one to two hours. There are short descriptions of each segment below, plus questions for personal reflection. You may want to plan out a few blocks of time in which to watch the videos. We understand that engaging these videos will take a certain commitment, but we are in this together. We hope you will experience these videos at your own pace and then come together with others in your Mercy circle to share community conversation and get lingering questions answered.



# **Pre-Work**

# Luke 6:46–49

**Building on a Solid Foundation**: "So why do you keep calling me 'Lord, Lord!' when you don't do what I say? I will show you what it's like when someone comes to me, listens to my teaching and then follows it. It is like a person building a house who digs deep and lays the foundation on solid rock. When the floodwaters rise and break against that house, it stands firm because it is well built. But anyone who hears and doesn't obey is like a person who builds a house right on the ground, without a foundation. When the floods sweep down against that house, it will collapse into a heap of ruins." (*New Living Foundation*)



### **Segment 1: Laying a Foundation**

In this Gender Identity 101 segment, <u>Dr. Erin Cross</u>, director of the University of Pennsylvania LGBT Center, presents a concise and engaging introduction to what gender identity is and how it is formed. She also answers questions posed by the Zoom participants.

- 1. What has been your personal lived experience of gender identity? What factors (Church, family, society, culture, media, school, peers, etc.) have affected your understanding?
- 2. What did you hear that was new? Or what did you hear presented in a new way?



### Segment 2: Framing Context and Experience

In this highly engaging segment, <u>Dr. Erin Swenson</u>, a Presbyterian minister and marriage and family therapist, guides us through the evolving historical, theological and social understandings of gender identity. She draws upon her own experiences as a trans woman to teach through story and make connections. She answers questions posed by the Zoom participants.

The sharing is inspiring, vulnerable, thoughtful and graced. The panelists generously engage with the Zoom participants' comments and questions.
